



CHARLES ARCHIBALD HARRISON-JONES, 2nd Lieutenant, F.M.S.V.F. Only son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Harrison-Jones, of Daleacre, Rushmere Road, Ipswich. He entered School House in 1930, rowed for the House, leaving in 1935 with a Science Scholarship to St. John's College, Oxford, where he read Chemistry and obtained an Honours Degree. In 1938 he was selected for the Malayan Civil Service and went up to Oxford for a fourth year before going out to Malaya in 1939. Early in the war he joined the F.M.S. Volunteer Force. He was captured by the Japanese at Singapore and died in November, 1943, from ill effects of working on the infamous Burma Siam Railway.
