

EDWARD NORMAN ANDREWS was born on April 22, 1897. He was the youngest son of Dr. Collingwood Andrews of Hampstead. He came to Oundle from Heath Mount School, Hampstead, in the summer term of 1911, entering School House.

He was a school prefect and captain of boating.

Leaving school in July 1914, he entered the Royal Military College, Sandhurst, in October 1916, and was subsequently appointed Corporal. Passing out of Sandhurst in December 1917, he was gazetted Second Lieutenant in the Buffs, and after a delay due to a broken arm, proceeded to the front at the end of July 1918.

He was fatally wounded while leading his platoon to the attack on August 22, and died the following day.

A brother Officer wrote: "He led his platoon with complete disregard of danger, encouraging the men until wounded. His bravery and devotion to duty were an inspiration to his platoon."
