

FRANK RHODES ARMITAGE was the eldest son of Dr. J. Auriol Armitage of Hastings, and formerly of Wolverhampton. He was born at Edinburgh on July 6, 1883. He entered Laxton House in September 1896 and remained for six years; he was the first of four brothers who were at this house.

He was a school prefect, head of his house, and a member of the XI. In 1902 he went up to Pembroke College, Cambridge (with a Scholarship for Classics) and there studied medicine, proceeding in 1906 to the London Hospital, where he was for some time assistant surgeon to out-patients. Later he succeeded to his father's practice.

When the war came he joined the R.A.M.C. and was awarded the D.S.O. early in 1917. He was killed in July of the same year.

Armitage was a brilliant golfer and a strong cross country runner.
