

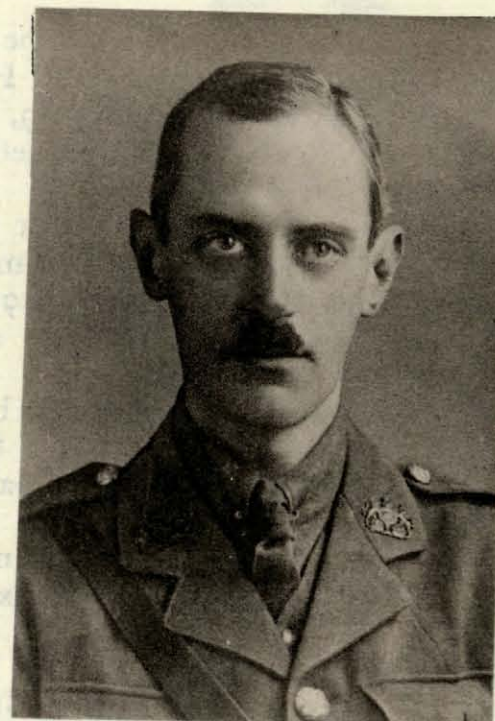
JAMES ALLAN ROSS ARMITAGE was the third son of Dr. J. A. Armitage of Wolverhampton and Hastings. Born on December 12, 1888, he entered Laxton House in September 1901.

He was a school prefect, a member of the XV and Captain of Fives. He left in 1907.

Accepting a commission in the 15th West Yorkshire Regiment he had been promoted Captain when he was recalled from Egypt by the Ministry of Munitions to take charge of the Farnley Ironworks.

He was married in 1918, but his health, impaired by his work in Egypt, again broke down, and he retired to St. Leonard's in the autumn of that year.

He died on July 19, 1919.
