

BERNARD PAUL GASCOIGNE BEANLANDS was the only surviving son of the late Canon Beanlands and Mrs. Beanlands of Wickhurst Manor, Weald. He was born at Victoria, British Columbia, on September 9, 1897. Coming to England he entered Oundle (the Berrystead) in May 1909; he was later transferred to School House.

In August 1914 he passed into Sandhurst, leaving there in the following December, when he was gazetted to the 1st Hampshire Regiment. He went to France in January 1915 and was through the second battle of Ypres.

Later he transferred to the Flying Corps.

In December 1917 he was awarded the Military Cross.

During the German offensive of March 1918 he was seriously wounded, and on his recovery was appointed Examining Wing Officer to the 18th Wing R.A.F. He was accidentally killed while flying at Northolt on May 8, 1919.
