

GUY EDWIN BOSTOCK was the second son of Mr. and Mrs. E. Bostock of Sunnyside, Stafford, where he was born on February 7, 1894. He entered Dryden in September 1909, and before leaving in July 1913 he was head of his house, school prefect, and captain of boating.

Leaving Oundle he went up to Emmanuel College, Cambridge, with a Scholarship. At Cambridge he gained distinction as an oar, rowing in the University Trial Eights.

He was gazetted to the 8th Royal Munster Fusiliers as Lieutenant in September 1914, and was promoted Captain in October 1915. Going to France with his battalion in December of 1915, he was killed in action at Loos on January 30, 1916. He was buried at Mazingarbe.

The Officer Commanding the 8th Royal Munster Fusiliers describes him as a most valuable company officer, and adds: "We deplore the loss of a gallant soldier, a good friend, and a very honourable gentleman."
