

**F**RANK BRAY was the eldest son of Mrs. Bray of Scalby, Scarborough, and Moortown, Leeds, where he was born on October 22, 1898. He entered School House in September, 1912, and left in December 1916. He was a House prefect and in the sixth form.

Leaving school he was trained for flying, and received a commission in the Royal Naval Air Service. After proceeding to France, he was on patrol with several other machines, and in a general engagement, in which the enemy lost one machine, Bray's machine was brought down in flames on the German side of the lines.

He was at first reported missing, but afterwards was stated to have been killed on July 15, 1917.

His Squadron Commander wrote: "His loss is deeply mourned by everybody in the squadron, with whom he was very popular. I know that I have lost a very good and extremely gallant officer."
