

GEOFFREY CLIFFORD CALVERT was the fourth and youngest son of Mr. and Mrs. Rhodes K. Calvert of Leeds. He was born on April 1, 1894.

From the preparatory school for Sedbergh he went for a time to that school, where his brothers had been educated, and was transferred to Oundle in May 1910. Entering New House, he left in July 1911, having been a member of the XV.

After leaving school he joined the Headingley Football Club, and was a member of the Yorkshire XV. In December 1913 he played for the North in the English Trial Match. When war broke out he had served two years of his pupilage with Messrs. John Fowler and Co. (Leeds).

Receiving a commission in the 8th East Yorkshire Regiment, he went to France with them in 1915. He was through the battle of Loos, but after service in the flooded trenches of the Ypres salient (1916), he was invalided home, and spent six months in hospital.

Transferred to the King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry he returned to France, and did duty in a forward area until he contracted typhoid and pneumonia, and died on January 15, 1919, at a casualty clearing station.
