

**S**YDNEY TRUMAN DUROSE was the only son of Arthur Durose, F.C.A., and Mrs. A. M. Durose of Radlett, Hertfordshire. He was born at Nottingham on July 18, 1892. Before coming to Oundle he was at West House, Edgbaston. He entered Sidney in May 1907 and left in July 1910.

He was articled to his father and was reading for the final examination of the Institute of Chartered Accountants when war broke out in August 1914. Joining the Nottingham University O.T.C. he was granted a commission in the 7th Sherwood Foresters on October 6, 1914.

Proceeding to France in July, 1915, he was in several engagements at Loos and Hooge. Invalided home at the end of 1915, he was in England for some months until posted to Ireland, where he remained until January 1917. Proceeding to France with his regiment he was in the line near St. Quentin. He fell on April 2, 1917, leading his men in the attack on Le Verguier.

He was buried by the Germans in the village cemetery, together with four of his men.
