

CHARLES BERTRAM DYSON was the eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Dyson of Reedley, Lancashire, where he was born on December 10, 1896.

He entered Oundle (Grafton House) in January 1909, and was at the school until the end of the Lent term 1914.

In December 1914 he was given a commission in the 5th East Lancashire Regiment. He went to France in December 1916, and was later appointed Intelligence Officer to the 126th Infantry Brigade, 42nd Division.

He was killed in action at Gommecourt on March 26, 1918.
