

**A**RTHUR JAMES GOODFELLOW was the only son of Mr. and Mrs. James Goodfellow of Brantwood, Higher Crumpsall, Manchester. Born at Manchester on June 9, 1887, he came to Oundle (School House) in January 1902 and left in July 1904. In his last summer he played for the XI.

After leaving school he was a keen volunteer and Territorial officer, and at the time of his death had been for many years with the Salford Fusiliers, being promoted Captain in 1911. In business he was with the firm of Messrs. Henry Marsden and Company, wholesale clothiers.

Goodfellow went out to Gallipoli with the 8th battalion Lancashire Fusiliers and was killed in action on August 8, 1915.

He was mentioned in Sir Ian Hamilton's despatch of November 1915.

An officer wrote: "Quite fearless himself, he made his men a resolute lot, and was always devising some new expedient. He is a real loss to those of us who knew him."

He married in January 1915 (at Cairo) Miss Doris Langtry, only daughter of the late Mr. Redfern Langtry and Mrs. Langtry of Hale, Cheshire.
