

GERALD HENRY GREENFIELD was the elder son of the late Henry Greenfield of Southwell, Notts, and Mrs. Greenfield of Edenmore, Woking. He was born at Southwell on November 2, 1896.

Entering Sidney House in September 1910, he remained at School until July 1915.

Before leaving he was head of his house and a school prefect. He was also a sergeant in the O.T.C., and played for the Football Team.

After passing the first M.B., London, he entered St. Bartholomew's Hospital, and was shortly afterwards given a nomination for the R.M.A., Woolwich, where he became senior sergeant. Gazetted to the R.F.A. in August 1916, he went to the front in September.

On August 15, 1917, he was hit by a sniper while acting as Forward Observation Officer near Zillebek and died on August 17 in the third Canadian Casualty Clearing Station. He was buried in Lyssenhoek Military Cemetery.

An officer wrote: "He was always so cheerful, and absolutely fearless at all times, and a general favourite, not only in his battery but in the whole brigade.

"We shall miss him sadly—always."
