

HUGH CHARLES GREENHALGH was the second son of Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Greenhalgh of Dawley, Shropshire, and was born on October 7, 1889. He was at Oundle (Grafton House) from September 1904 to November 1906.

He joined the Public Schools Battalion of the Middlesex Regiment within the first month of war, and having qualified in musketry, bombing and sniping, became Musketry Sergeant.

When the Battalion went to France he was transferred to the Reserve Unit, subsequently took a commission, and was gazetted to the same battalion in September 1915, when he was appointed Musketry Officer.

He went to France in July 1916, and was killed on the night of May 5, 1917, while leading his platoon into action.
