

DOUGLAS HOWARD WILSON GREENWAY was the second son of Mr. and Mrs. Herbert H. Greenway of Moseley, Birmingham, where he was born on April 25, 1891. He entered Laxton House in January 1906 and left in July 1907. In August 1914 Greenway was Secretary to Gaskell and Chambers Ltd., Manufacturers, of Birmingham, and he at once joined the Royal Warwickshire Regiment (City Battalion). In February 1915 he was given a commission in the 13th Worcestershire Regiment and went out to Gallipoli in September.

He was killed on October 17, 1915, while he was bringing in wounded men.

An officer wrote: "He was bringing in a covering party, when a sniper got him. Several of the covering party had been wounded and he went out three or four times to fetch them in. For a piece of unselfish gallantry, it will be a long time before Greenway's deed is surpassed."
