

JOSEPH ROLAND GRUMMITT was the eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. H. J. Grummitt of Hornsea, East Yorkshire, where he was born on August 26, 1894. He entered Dryden in September 1907.

In August 1914 Grummitt was in Canada, where he joined the first Canadian Contingent. He fought with them during 1915 and 1916 at Ypres, Givenchy and Festubert, where he was wounded.

In October 1916 he accepted a commission in the East Yorkshire Regiment and went overseas again in January 1917.

He was for some time signalling officer with the fourth battalion, and eventually returned to England at the end of February 1918 for six months' home service.

He died from pneumonia at Colchester Military Hospital on November 14, 1918.
