

**R**OBERT CLIVE HARVEY was the third son of Colonel and Mrs. R. Harvey of Uplands, Rothley, Leicester, where he was born on January 12, 1896. He entered the Berrystead in January 1908 and was transferred later to Crosby.

After leaving school in July 1912 he studied French at Neurchâtel, where he gained his diploma. Shortly before war broke out he had decided to become a missionary.

He applied for a commission early in August and was gazetted to the Leicestershire Regiment, eventually going to France with the 1/4th Battalion, and it was while fighting with them in the assault on the Hohenzollern Redoubt that he met his death on October 13, 1915. His rank at the time was Lieutenant.

His Commanding Officer wrote: "I cannot . . . think of any occasion on which Clive failed me. He had an absolutely imperturbable coolness under trying conditions, a considerable gift for leadership, and was always thoughtful for the men's welfare. Officers such as he will always be followed."
