

**K**ENNETH CHAMPION JONES was the fifth son of Mr. and Mrs. Frederick Jones of "Lanherne," Albemarle Road, Beckenham.

He was born at Sydenham on May 18, 1891, entered Oundle (School House) in May 1904 and was at school until December 1909.

In August 1914 he was articled to a firm of Chartered accountants and was about to take his final examination.

Joining the Artists' Rifles he went out to France in December and in June 1915 obtained a commission in the 1st East Lancashire Regiment.

On July 14, 1916, he was reported "missing, believed killed," near Beaumont Hamel.

It was presumed that he led his men into the German lines and was cut off, as his body could not be found.
