

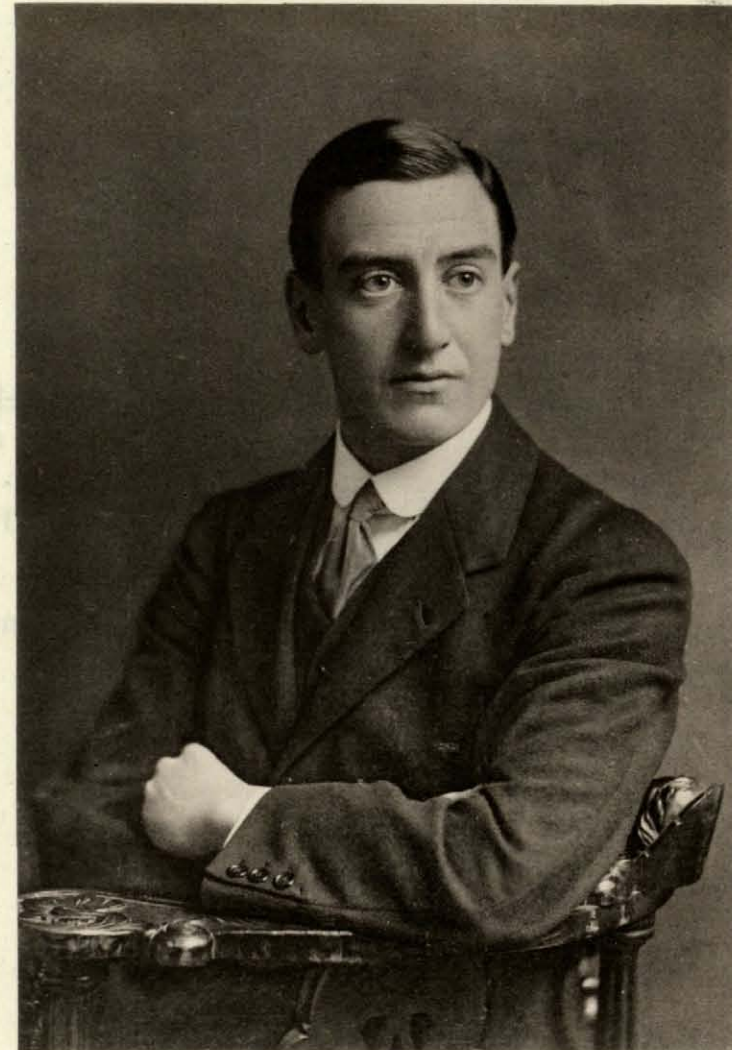
**A**LBERT EVELYN FAIRFAX KYNASTON was the second son of Dr. and Mrs. A. E. Kynaston of Folkingham, Lincolnshire, where he was born on January 1, 1881.

He was for a time at Tockleton Hall, Shrewsbury, before entering Laxton House in January 1895. He left in July 1898. Entering Guy's Hospital in 1899 he took the London University Course and qualified as M.R.C.S. and L.R.C.P. in 1904. In 1907 he went to the Poplar and Stepney Sick Asylum, with which institution he was associated until the outbreak of war.

A friend wrote of him: "Everyone who worked with him got to love him."

In the first week of the war Kynaston joined the Royal Naval Reserve as Temporary Surgeon, R.N., and was sent to H.M.S. Devonshire.

He died of enteric and pneumonia, while on active service, on October 13, 1914, at Dunskaith, Cromarty. He was buried in the Naval Cemetery there.
