

**S**TANLEY JOHN MARLOW was the eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. A. E. Marlow of Preston Deanery Hall, Northampton. He was born at Darlington on August 1, 1895.

Coming to Oundle from Bilton Grange, Rugby, he entered New House in January 1910. He became a keen member of the O.T.C., with whom he spent two camps on Salisbury Plain. In May 1914 he joined the Territorial Force and was promoted Lieutenant a month after war broke out. Marlow was killed at the battle of Gaza, after serving in Gallipoli and Palestine.

At Gaza he was second in command of his company, and with characteristic courage was right in front of his men, cheering them on by his gallant example, when he was killed instantly.
