

RANDALL STEWART MASON was the son of Mr. and Mrs. G. S. Mason, the Hayway, Rushden, Northants, where he was born on July 14, 1894.

Entering Oundle (Crosby House) in 1907, he was at school until 1912, in which year he went up to Jesus College, Cambridge. Mason was prominent on the cricket field, playing for the school in 1911 and 1912.

At Cambridge he frequently assisted the University at golf, of which game he was an accomplished player.

On August 15, 1914, he was given a commission in the Special Reserve, and on September 21 he was gazetted to the 6th Battalion of the Rifle Brigade.

In December 1914 he went with a draft to France to join the second battalion.

In March 1915 came the battle of Neuve Chapelle, and on the 12th Mason was killed in the second advance.

He was buried in the churchyard at Neuve Chapelle.
