

FREDERICK RAYMOND MILHOLLAND was the eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. J. F. Milholland of Kingston, Jamaica, where he was born on January 1, 1896.

Coming to England in 1907, he entered New House in September 1909. He was captain of the School in 1913 and 1914, and was a member of the XV in 1912 and 1913.

He was elected Domus Exhibitioner at Balliol College, Oxford, and Rhodes Scholar for Jamaica (1914).

From the School Corps he was gazetted to the Yorkshire Regiment, and did not go into residence at Oxford.

He was wounded in Mametz Wood (Somme) in 1916, and in 1917 was promoted Lieutenant and Captain. He died in No. 1 Casualty Clearing Station on February 27, 1918.

He was out with a runner inspecting the front line when he was hit by a sniper, and it was some time before he could be taken to a Field Ambulance. From there he was taken to the Clearing Station, but died an hour after being admitted.

He was a nephew of the partners of James Pain and Sons, Mitcham, and a director of James Pain and Sons, Ltd., their successors.
