

**M**AURICE JAMES MISKIN was the son of Mr. and Mrs. James Miskin of Queen Anne's Road, York.

He joined the school staff in September 1914, and was at Oundle until Christmas, when he obtained a transfer to the 9th North Staffordshire Regiment.

After eighteen months' service he was promoted Captain, but in January 1917 he transferred to the Tank Corps, starting again as Second Lieutenant.

He was in the great success at Messines and in the Cambrai "Push," when he was awarded the Military Cross. In August 1918 he was promoted Major. He was killed on October 17 while leading his Tanks into action.

He was looking forward to rejoining the School staff in the following term.
