

**N**OEL CAMPBELL KYRLE MONEY was the third son of Colonel R. E. Money, and was born in India on December 6, 1882. He entered School House in September 1897, leaving in July 1900. Money played for the XI in 1900.

Passing through Woolwich he was for seven years in the Royal Garrison Artillery, and eventually transferred into the 22nd Punjaubis, Indian Army.

When war broke out, he was in England on leave and was taken for service in the new armies, being posted to the 5th Service Battalion the Connaught Rangers. He joined at Richmond Barracks, Dublin, on August 24, 1914, the battalion then numbering 220 N.C.O's. and men. In December, Money was promoted Major.

Early in July 1915 the battalion proceeded to Gallipoli. On September 2, Major Money was wounded in the head. He was taken down at once to a hospital ship but he never recovered consciousness, and died at sea near Malta on September 7.

His C.O. wrote: "Major Money had joined the Battalion at Richmond Barracks, Dublin, on August 24, 1914, and his work since then had been an unbroken spell of hard and good work for the Regiment to which he had been appointed, and which he loved so well."

He was married to Miss Dorothea Stansbury, daughter of Dr. Stansbury, formerly Headmaster of Oundle. After his death, his name was included in the list of those awarded the Distinguished Service Order, and he was mentioned in dispatches for his gallant share in the Dardanelles operations.
