

KENNETH JOHN MOWBRAY was the eldest son of the Rev. and Mrs. J. R. W. Mowbray of Toppesfield Rectory, Castle Hedingham, Essex. He was born at Bristol on June 25, 1896, and entered Oundle (Dryden House) in September 1910, leaving in July 1914.

After passing through Sandhurst he was posted to the 3rd Suffolk Regiment, and eventually joined the 2nd Battalion, finding as his Commanding Officer Lieut.-Col. G. C. Stubbs, under whom he had been at Sandhurst.

He fell on April 9, 1917, while leading his men to the attack.

His Commanding Officer wrote: "He was under me at Sandhurst, and I was glad to get him as an officer. His loss is a great one to us, and the consolation must be that his company achieved a fine performance."
