

HENRY COLLISTER MULOCK was the only son of the late Mr. and Mrs. G. P. Mulock, and nephew of Mrs. Alfred Austin of Swinford Old Manor, Ashford. He was born in Lancashire on November 27, 1891.

He entered Oundle (New House) in September 1907 and left in July 1908. In 1914 Mulock joined the South Staffordshire Regiment, transferring later to the Royal Flying Corps.

At the time of his death, on February 15, 1917, he was in charge of all the photographic work of his squadron (No. 52 Squadron R.F.C.) and had received the personal thanks of the corps for his good work.

His Commanding Officer wrote: "He died as he lived, a brave man and a gallant officer: always prepared to do his job without thinking of himself."

Another Officer said: "He was about the bravest and most popular man in the Squadron and was tremendously keen on his branch of the work—he took the finest series of aerial photographs of our Corps front I have ever seen, often under considerable interference by hostile scouts."
