

THOMAS STANLEY NEWELL was the second son of Mr. and Mrs. T. M. Newell of Westwood, Noctorum, Birkenhead, and was born at Hull on August 15, 1895.

He entered the Berrystead in September 1906, being transferred later to Dryden, and left in July 1914. He was a sergeant in the O.T.C.

Soon after war broke out he joined the Cheshire Regiment, and with the 2nd battalion proceeded to France.

He met his death on July 5, 1915, while engaged in digging trenches, a duty for which his company had been detailed while they were having a rest out of the trenches.

He was hit by a chance bullet and died in a dressing station.
