

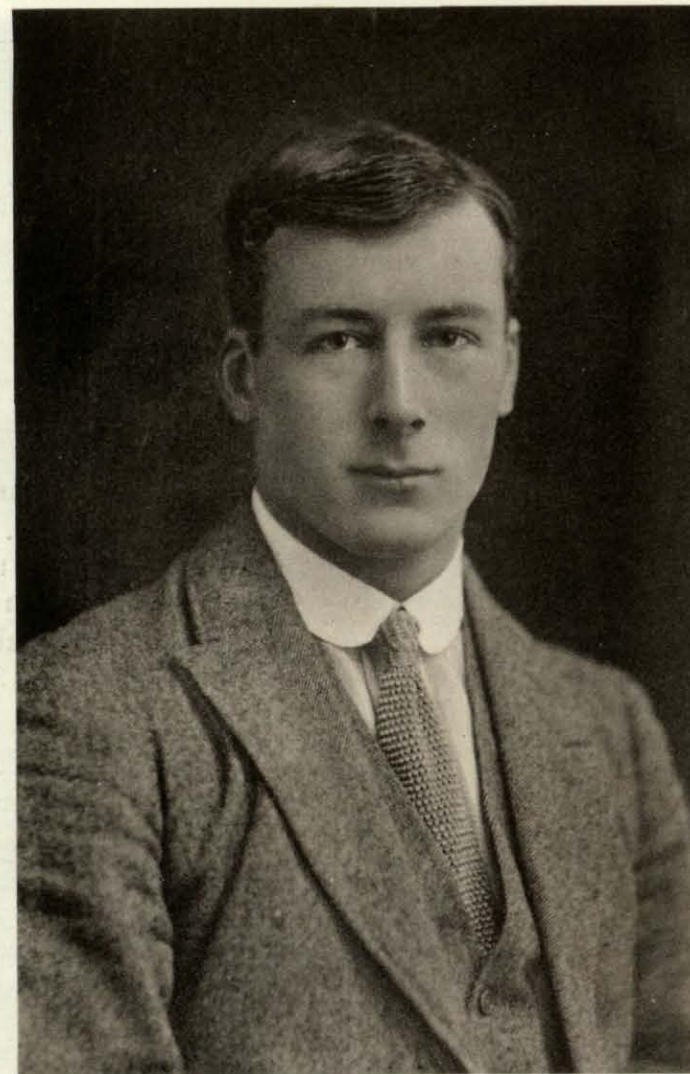
**R**OY BROUGHTON SANDERSON was the eldest son of the Head master and Mrs. Sanderson. Born at Dulwich on February 18, 1889, he entered the School House in April 1898, leaving in July 1908, when he was head of the School, captain of the XV, and a prominent swimmer.

Going up to Queen's College, Cambridge, as a scholar, he read for the Mathematical and Mechanical Science Triposes, and was captain of his College XV.

After serving a pupilage under Mr. E. C. Trench, the chief engineer of the London and North Western Railway, he was appointed to the Staff of the Royal Naval College, Osborne. Given leave of absence by the Admiralty, he was gazetted second lieutenant in the R.G.A. and went to France.

He was invalided home for a year, at the end of which time he married Miss Margaret Rowell, of Cambridge (December 1917).

Promoted lieutenant, he returned to the front and died of wounds on April 20, 1918.
