

REGINALD HERBERT SECRETAN was the second son of Mr. and Mrs. Herbert Secretan of Leverstock Green, Hertfordshire. He was born at Ewell on June 22, 1895, and entered Oundle (Sidney House) in September 1909, leaving in July 1914.

After several attempts to join the army, which were unsuccessful owing to his short sight, he was accepted by the A.S.C. (M.T.), as a motor driver and dispatch rider. After 18 months' service he came home to take a commission (August 1916).

He joined the Hertfordshire Regiment in France in January 1917 and fell in action on July 31, 1917, when leading his platoon against their final objective.

His Commanding Officer wrote: "He was always so cheerful and ready to do everything, that he was a great favourite with everyone."

Secretan was keen at all games, and excelled in many.
