

GEORGE EDWARD SEWELL was the eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. A. R. Sewell of St. Albans. He was born at Stamford Hill on March 31, 1898, and entered Oundle (Dryden House) in September 1912, leaving in December 1915.

He was in the shooting VIII.

From school he went to Sandhurst, and on passing out was attached to the 3rd Battalion the Buffs, at Dover. He specialized in Grenade Warfare at Godstone, took a Physical Training course at Aldershot, and returning to Dover was made Physical Training Officer to the battalion. Attaining the age of nineteen he was eager to go to France, and joined the 1st Battalion in June 1917. He died of wounds, received at Loos, on September 2, 1917.

His Major wrote: ". . . during the time he was with us he proved himself to be a most popular, gallant and trustworthy officer."
