

PHILIP EDMUND SHARPLES was the only son of the late Charles Philip Sharples, of Blackburn, and stepson of Mr. A. Cawood, of Sedbergh, and formerly of Oswestry.

He was born at Blackburn on May 25, 1896, and entered the Berrystead in September 1909, being transferred later to Laxton House. He left in December 1912.

Enlisting in the Sheffield City Battalion in September 1914, Sharples was given a commission in the 9th York and Lancaster Regiment in July 1915, and with them went to France. He was killed in action on June 7, 1917, near Ypres.
