REDERICK ALFRED TRENCHARD was the only son of Mr. and Mrs. R. B. Trenchard of Richmond, Surrey. He was born on April 12, 1888, and entered Oundle (Laxton House) in September 1902, leaving in July 1906 to go up to Cambridge. Trenchard was a school prefect and prominent in many branches of athletics. He was captain of Rowing, and a member of the XV for several years. Entering Trinity Hall he graduated in 1909, and represented his university in the sports of 1910.

He was gazetted to the R.F.A. from Cambridge in 1910, and went to France with his battery in September 1914. Mentioned in Sir John French's despatch of November 20, 1914, he was wounded in December, but remained with his battery, and on

May 24, 1915, fell in action.

In July 1914 he was married to Miss Frances Ann Barnett.
