

FREDERICK MAXWELL WAITE was the younger son of Mr. and Mrs. F. W. Waite of the Spinneys, Manor Road, Leicester. He was born on May 4, 1895, at Market Harborough and entered Grafton in January 1909. At school he was a keen member of the O.T.C.

On leaving school he was articled to Messrs. Hopps and Bankart, Chartered Accountants, of Leicester, and in August 1914 he joined the Army. He went to France early in March 1915 with the 4th Battalion of the Leicestershire Regiment and was killed in action in Flanders on June 7, 1915.

An Officer wrote: "He was always cheerful and was a real leader of men; he did not know what fear was; always a soldier and a gentleman, and beloved by all about him, ready for work or fun, each in its own place.

"His men would do anything for him and follow him anywhere."
