

ARTHUR ERNEST WYNN was the eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. A. E. Wynn of Rathgowry, Harrogate, and was born on July 24, 1896, at Eastbourne. He entered Oundle (Grafton House) in September 1910, and was at school until December 1912.

When war broke out Wynn was an engineering student in the Leeds University. Enlisting as a private, he was in the Motor Transport Service up to December 1915, when he was given a commission in the Flying Corps. On November 1, 1916, his machine was brought down near Bapaume (within the enemy's lines) and his name appeared later in a German list of killed.
